




The Christmas Scandal & The Number Forty Two

Matthew 1:18,19



18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: After His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit.

19 Then Joseph her husband, being a just *man, and not wanting to make her a public example, was minded to put her away secretly.*

Joseph was a descendent of Abraham which made him a member of the chosen race.

He was also a descendant of Israel which made him a member of the chosen nation.

He was directly descendent
from Judah which placed him
solidly in the tribe of the kings.

And he was also a direct
descendent of king David.

If fate had played his hand differently, he could have been king.

But the long line of failures in his holy line left him a carpenter in Caesar's kingdom.

In the Gospel of Matthew Joseph is in a long list of names in a genealogy that looks like its going nowhere.

Son of God – not his name.

The introduction of Jesus into the genealogy makes all the difference in the world for Joseph.






The book of the genealogy of

Matthew 1:1


Which is literally translated:

of Abraham.”**




Matthew 1:1

Matthew declares that Jesus is the new Adam - the beginning of a new creation...the Genesis of Jesus!




The New Adam

In the Next 15 verses of Matthew we find a fascinating genealogy that starts with Abraham and it ends with Jesus.




The New Adam

Looking at the genealogy, Jesus had every reason to fail as far as his family system was concerned.




The New Adam

- Abraham was a polygamist.
- Isaac lied to save his life.
- Jacob tried to steal his brother's birthright.




The New Adam

- Judah sold his brother into slavery and committed adultery.
- Tamar performed the work of a prostitute to gain children by Judah.
- Rahab was a prostitute too.




The New Adam

- Ruth was a Moabites. She tried to entice an intoxicated Boaz on the threshing floor to gain his favor.
- David murdered a man to steal his wife.




The New Adam

- Solomon led God's people into Idolatry.
- Rehoboam oppressed his people and destroyed the unity of the empire.
- Uzziah committed blasphemy and profaned the temple.




The New Adam

By any definition Jesus was connected to a dysfunctional family.




The New Adam

Jesus is a new genesis for failed families.




The New Adam

The meaning of the genealogy is summarized in Matthew 1:17.




The New Adam

So all the generations from Abraham to David were fourteen generations, and from David to the deportation to Babylon fourteen generations, and from the deportation to Babylon to the Christ fourteen generations.




Matthew 1:17

The Genealogy is comprised of three groupings of 14, which together adds up to 42.




The Number

In Numbers 33, Israel camped 42 times before they entered the Promised Land.




The Number

times.




The Number

In the book of Revelation the church goes into the wilderness for 42 months.




The Number

God's true shepherd.




The Number 42

Joseph finds his place in the genealogy as the son of captivity just before number 42.




Joseph

number 42.




The Number 42

from captivity to freedom.




The Number 42

Jesus is the only way out of the wilderness.




The Number 42



part.




In ancient times,

binding.




If you were

found it out.




And so the Genesis
of Jesus starts with
a scandal.



It looks like
Jesus will be
number 42 in a
long line of
losers.



If Joseph had exposed Mary publically, Joseph would have no doubt avoided the stigma of violating the waiting time of the engagement.



Unless Joseph exposed Mary publically, he would no doubt become himself a possible candidate for the man that had made Mary pregnant before the appointed time of marriage.



So Joseph's
decision to divorce
her quietly left
Joseph with the
stigma of
suspicion.

But as he considered this, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit;

law of Moses.




The spirit of

¹ In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.


² The earth was without form and void, and darkness was upon the face of the deep; and the Spirit of God was moving over the face of the waters.



The prognosis for
Joseph and Mary
was dark.



- How do you fix a mess you didn't make?
- How do you extract yourself from a scandal you don't deserve?
- How do you survive the shame and the blame for the crime you did not commit?



The angel in the dream told Joseph that the Holy Spirit was the one who made Mary pregnant.





How believable is that?

Imagine Joseph trying to explain the whole thing at the door of the synagogue.




With a stutter in his
voice he says:

“I’m planning to marry
Mary.

Yes she’s pregnant.

No the Baby is not
mine.



Yes we're engaged.

But the baby isn't anyone else's either.

It's true – really!

The baby has a mother – but no Daddy.

I'm just a fill in.



Mary is the first woman in history to have a baby without a man to help her have the baby.

In the Old
Testament, a
father named his
son.



In any scenario,
you don't have a
right to name a
child that is not
yours.



And so the command of the angel is the offer to a man with an uncertain future – the choice - to adopt the little Lord Jesus.



The Son of God
must become the
son of Joseph,
the carpenter, to
become the son
of David and the
son of Adam.



His people must
choose him by
Joseph's choice
for Him to save
his people from
their sins.



Joseph was
named after the
son of Jacob
who would
become Israel.



The ancient Joseph went to Egypt and lived in captivity.

He saved his brothers, his Father, and his whole family from famine and certain death.

He brought them all to Egypt and he protected them from a certain death in a foreign land.



The new Joseph stands on
a new plain in salvation
history.

The new Israel is not a
nation this time.

The new Israel in the
gospel of Matthew is a
child.




Matthew 2:14,15




His people - from Abraham
to Joseph – His people.


42 generations until Jesus.

wilderness.


There were 42 stages in

promised land.




In his dream that night, Joseph understood the angel's command well.



The child in Mary's womb
is no doubt the Son of

I don’t need this kind of stress in my life.




But he didn't do it.


He accepted Jesus as his son with the entire stigma and all the shame that comes with the scandal of salvation that is the Genesis of Jesus.

Christmas.




To be a Christian

Who qualifies here as his people?








But to all who
